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HOW TO USE THIS WORKSHEET


Dawn Of Purpose is an inspiring, modern-day parable. It was written with one simple goal in mind: to help you find what you were made for.

Your purpose is everything. It is the fuel that makes your heart sing! Is there something in your life that excites you, and tugs on your heart? Or do you simply feel lost, with a purpose-shaped hole?

Wherever you may be on your path to purpose, this worksheet is for you. In this official companion resource to *Dawn Of Purpose*, you will find a series of questions. These have been designed to work alongside the book, to open your heart and help you develop your own thoughts on your purpose. Be sure to complete all the questions, so that at the end, you can write an accurate purpose statement.

It is recommended that you answer these questions by yourself, in your own time. And then, afterwards, discuss your answers with someone you trust.

So, grab your copy of *Dawn of Purpose*, and something to write with—and let us begin!








ANGELO






MUD AND WILLIAM




FELICITY






JOANNA




